### **Recent Reports**

Kirkleatham: An Archaeological assessment by P. Rowe.....£5.00

This document aims to provide an up to date assessment of the archaeological resource at Kirkleatham. From the medieval settlement there to the re-ordering of the landscape in the 17th century commencing with the building of Kirkleatham Hall in 1625. (1998)

Middlesbrough 19th Century Industrial Survey by P. Rowe .....£5.00

Results of a survey to record the early industries and industrial infrastructure of Middlesbrough, indicating where industrial features survive and in what condition. (1998)

The Archaeology of East Marton by P. Rowe .....£2.00

A summary of the recent research into the deserted village of East Marton, the birthplace of Captain Cook. (1998)

North Street, Stockton by R. Annis.....£3.00

Results of a survey of North Street, Union Square and Smith Street in Stockton-on-Tees in July 1997. The old terraced houses were due to be demolished for the proposed development of a shopping centre at the North-West end of Stockton High Street. (1997)

St. Helen's Church, Eston by P.F.Ryder.....£5.00

The ruin of this church was dismantled in 1999 to be rebuilt at Beamish Open Air Museum. This report tells the history of the church and the surprises found during its dismantling. (1998)

The 19<sup>th</sup> Century Industrial Archaeology of Stockton-on-Tees by P.Rowe.....£5.00

Stockton was the birthplace of the passenger railway. The industrial archaeology of the town is set out in this survey of remains carried out in 1999 (1999)

Archaeological Survey of Upleatham by P.Rowe and S.Sherlock.....£5.00

The Upleatham Hills were home to prehistoric hunter-gatherers, Bronze Age farmers and more recently teams of ironstone miners. In 1999 the remains were catalogued and can be visited with the aid of this report (1999)

This report updates the earlier Lost at Sea document. It gives a review of maritime archaeology in the area in the 1990s. Essential for all maritime enthusiasts. (1999)

Lost At Sea by J.Buglass.....£5.00

Maritime Archaeology survey of the coastline from Seaham Harbour to Whitby, with local information and records for all the known sites to the 12 nautical mile limit. (1994)

Greatham Creek by P.Rowe.....£2.50

This report sets out the results of a survey of a navigable creek off the Tees Estuary now famous as the home of a seal colony. In the past the area was occupied by various industries and was heavily defended during the World Wars.(1999)

The 19<sup>th</sup> Century Industrial Archaeology of Hartlepool by P.Rowe.....£5.00

Learn how Hartlepool developed from a small fishing town to the fourth largest port in England. This report summarises the results of a survey undertaken in the year 2000 to catalogue industrial remains in the town. (2000)

The results of the excavation which took place before a footpath was placed at Highcliff Nab. It assesses the nature and extent of Mesolithic activity in the area. (DAJ 1996)

A summary of the excavation carried out in 1985 and 1986 which uncovered three successive churches. Also showing pre-Monastic land use and Saxon occupation. (YAJ 1995)

Bronze Age Activity on the Eston Hills by B.E. Vyner.....£2.50

Information and discussion on the Bronze Age activity in Kirkleatham, Ormesby, Eston Nab, Wilton and Eston Moor, detailing the finds and features on these sites. (YAJ 1991)

The results of the recent excavation of the hill-fort near Eston, incorporating the results of previous excavations by Frank Elgee in the 1920's and Alan Aberg in the 1960's. (AJ 1988)

Information on the investigation into prehistoric activity in the coastal area of East Cleveland. Detailing the early Bronze Age Palisaded Ritual Monument at Street House, Loftus. (PPS 1988)

A look at excavation results and the history of the castle site at Stockton-on-Tees before development of the castle shopping centre and multi-storey carpark. (AEY 1988)

The results of the excavation and survey undertaken in 1983 to establish the line of the Medieval Fortifications and their construction. (DAJ 1986)

The Neolithic Cairn at Street House by B.E. Vyner. ....£5.00

A summary of the excavation at Street House Farm, Loftus in 1980 and 1981 where it revealed a Neolithic cairn with timber facade and mortuary structure, overlain by a Bronze Age round barrow. (PPS 1984)

A summary of the excavation that took place in 1979. Also includes details of the finds and a discussion on the societies who lived there in different periods. (DAJ 1984)
